

## The EAA430 Flight Scholarships

***What is it?*** - A scholarship to provide basic aviation knowledge and introductory flight instruction to qualified youths.

***Who can apply?*** – Any boy or girl in junior high and/or high school age 12 thru 18 in the PA and Sequim areas interested in aviation and especially in a career in aviation.

***What would the scholarship provide?*** -

### Option I (age 16+):

- (a) three (3) hours of “special” Young Eagle flights with an EAA Chapter 430 pilot<sup>(1,2)</sup>.
- (b) two hours of dual instruction at Rite Brothers Aviation with a Certified Flight Instructor after having taken and passed the (free) ground school course provided by Sporty’s, or, alternatively, having passed the FAA written ground school exam.
- (c) Reduced rate for further flight instruction leading to a private pilot’s certificate (at scholarship winner’s expense)<sup>(3)</sup>.

### Option II (ages 12-18):

\$1000 stipend to attend the EAA Summer Camp for Young Aviators

### Option III (graduating high school senior):

Quarterly stipends, for books, at an aeronautical college, in the amount of \$125/quarter.

All Options: Free membership in EAA Chapter 430 until the age of 18

### ***Application requirements:***

- § Young Eagle Experience: Having made an introductory Young Eagle flight in the previous 12 months<sup>(2)</sup>.
- § Education background: copy of most recent academic transcript and list of any scholastic honors and/or achievements.
- § Recommendations: Two letters of reference from teachers, advisors and/or anyone familiar with the student’s academic achievement.
- § Essay: submit a 300 (?) word essay.

*(Either)*

Describe an extraordinary personage in aviation history (past or present) and how this person has inspired you.

*(or)*

Find out about three career opportunities in aviation. Pick one and find out the education, training and experience required for this profession and explain why this profession might interest you.

*(or)*

an alternate topic, subject to Chapter approval

<sup>(1)</sup> The extent of the “special” Young Eagle flights will be limited to those activities normally done at all Young Eagle rallies. The recipient will not engage in take-offs or landings or other advanced maneuvers. The purpose of the flights will be primarily to allow the recipient to experience the joys of flight. It is expected that one of the flights would be a short cross-country flight with a landing at a remote destination for a light lunch.

<sup>(2)</sup> Although it will be the usual case that the introductory Young Eagle flight will be part of one of the scheduled YE rallies, a nonscheduled introductory Young Eagle flight can be arranged with EAA Chapter 430 by appointment.

<sup>(3)</sup> EAA 430 has arranged with Rite Bros. for the scholarship winner to receive instruction at a reduced rate.
